We, Jocelyn & Murray Dalziel, permanent residents at 46 Nisbet Terrace, Kinloch, strongly object to the proposed revised proposal development of the Balance Land within the Seven Oaks subdivision.

We urge the Taupo District council decline the application for the following reasons:

- 1. The revised proposal does not comply with the Kinloch Community Structure Plan which was commissioned by the Taupo District Council and supported by the Kinloch community, to help ensure the orderly and sustainable development of Kinloch. The proposal before council is a significant deviation from the Kinloch Community Structure plan and District Plan, in terms of the density of development proposed, and the concerns regarding the adverse effects on Kinloch's unique character and amenity, and village 'feel'.
- 2. If this proposal was allowed to proceed it would set a very concerning precedent in demonstrating to developers that they can to a large extent ignore the land zoning, setbacks and building coverage in the Taupo District Plans.
- 3. Meeting existing demand for fresh water is an outstanding issue in Kinloch, with regular Summer restrictions and 'Boil water' notices (latest on the 3/4/25).
- 4. The Wastewater Treatment Plant is not coping adequately with continuing problems disposing of waste onto the Kinloch Golf Course at peak times. Question the impact of further land development which will contribute to and exceed the current servicing capacity of the Wastewater Treatment plant. If the plant is extended does the council have more green space to dispose of the effluent?
- 5. Be aware, the 'Jack Nicklaus Golf club', are now marketing their Fairways sections, therefore envisage within the next five years they will be built on, which will increase the

demands on the existing Waste water Treatment Plant and supply of fresh water, which even under current level of housing, is not coping over peak periods. The 'ack Nicklaus Golf club' are also now planning to market their 'Plateau sites', on the Eastern boundary of the course. Have the council taken into consideration these two developments?

- 6. We do not see the necessity for a commercial hub/kindergarten in the proposed Seven Oaks commercial location, with the Henry Hall Trust now applying for Resource Consent to develop the former Trev Terry site to establish a supermarket and cafe and further space for retail or other activities. The Henry Hall Trust is also proposing to make land available at 261 Kinloch road, Kinloch, for light commercial activity/a community hall with potential kindergarten attached with green space for recreation and sports, which will satisfy the community needs in the long term.
- 7. In conclusion; the revised proposal of the Balance Land sub division within the 'Seven Oaks' subdivision, is not in keeping with the character of the Kinloch settlement and requirements of the community and the Kinloch Community Structure Plan.
